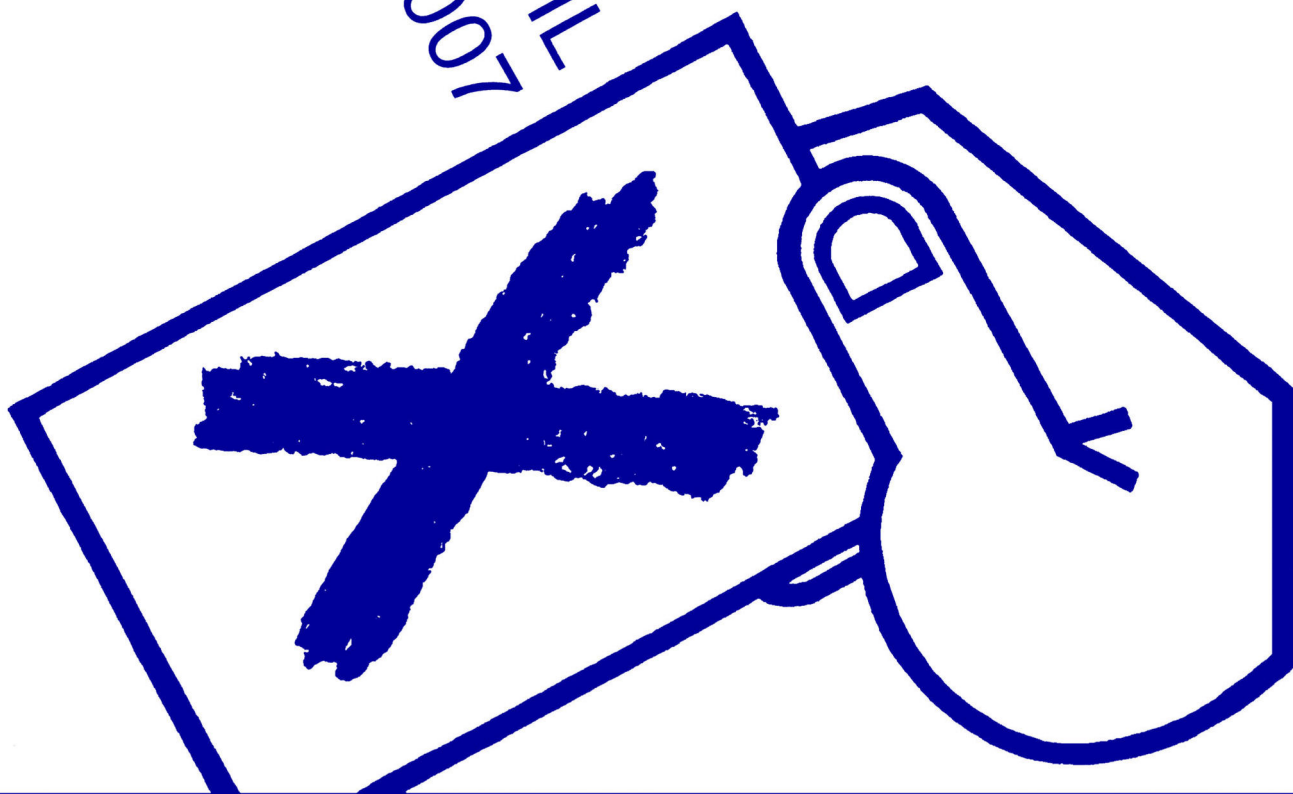

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PREFACE

The fourth round of elections for the unitary Scottish local councils took place on May 3rd 2007. As in the previous rounds in 1999 and 2003, these were held on the same day as the Scottish Parliament elections. This was despite the fact that in the interim the Arbuthnott Commission, set up to report on elections in Scotland, had firmly recommended the ‘decoupling’ of the two sets of elections (Commission on Boundary Differences and Voting Systems, 2006, pp. 48-51). As a result, in terms of media attention the local elections were once again largely overshadowed by the Scottish Parliament elections during the campaign. In the immediate aftermath of the elections, however, the decoupling issue came to the fore. This was because of the apparent confusion surrounding voting in the Scottish Parliament elections which resulted in a huge increase in the number of ballots that were rejected. The fact that voters had to cope with a new electoral system for local elections, which involved a new way of voting, certainly did not help matters.

The Single Transferable Vote (STV) electoral system for council elections was introduced by the Local Governance (Scotland) Act passed by the Scottish Parliament in 2004. This was the ‘pound of flesh’ that the Liberal Democrats extracted as the price of their continuing the coalition arrangement with Labour in the Scottish Executive. Labour proceeded with the change even although the party was bound to lose seats under the new system.

The introduction of STV had a number of important consequences (apart from producing different election outcomes). First, implementing the new system required a complete redrawing of ward boundaries to create new wards that would elect either three or four councillors. This was undertaken by the Scottish Local Government Boundary Commission and the final outcome was a reduction from 1,222 single member wards to 353 multi-member wards, 190 electing three councillors and 163 electing four, with the total number of councillors remaining at 1,222 (for details of the work of the Boundary Commission see <http://www.lgbc-scotland.gov>). Second, since counting votes and determining results under STV can be a lengthy and arduous process, it was decided to introduce electronic counting. Early trials of the technology involved were not entirely encouraging – in at least one demonstration the systems crashed. There was also much criticism of computerised counting on election night and immediately after. Scottish parliament counts were slower than they had been when conducted manually and several counts had to be abandoned as the technology failed to cope. In respect of the council elections however, counting went fairly smoothly and initial results were announced reasonably quickly after counting began. Finally, STV creates problems for commentators and analysts. How are the results to be reported? The Scottish press simply listed the winning candidates in each ward. That is clearly inadequate for analysis or for anyone with a serious interest in local elections. On the other hand, it is clearly impossible, without producing a massive tome, to present the full voting details, including vote transfers, for every ward. We have obtained details of electorates, first preference votes for each candidate, rejected ballots and candidates elected, directly from council officials and these are the details we present here for each ward, showing in addition the share of first preferences obtained by each party. In addition, ward turnout is indicated. Identifying women candidates has been made more difficult by the relaxation of the rule requiring candidates to give their full names on nomination papers. As a consequence it is difficult to know, for example, whether ‘Pat’ is an abbreviation for Patricia or Patrick. Nonetheless, we have identified candidates who we believe are women by the prefix ‘Ms’. Retiring incumbent councillors are indicated by the symbol ‘=’. The

number of rejected ballots is not shown, but a summary of these is given in the Appendix, Table 2, and rejected ballots are included in the calculations of turnout.

Councils are listed in alphabetical order – including the prefixes ‘East’, ‘West’, and so on – since this now appears to be accepted practice. Since 2003 the council formerly known as Comhairle nan Eilean Siar has changed its name to the equally incomprehensible, for most, Na h-Eileanan an Iar. Within authorities, wards are listed by number. The abbreviations used to identify the party affiliations of candidates are as follows:

We have classified candidates as ‘Independent’ if they described themselves as such on nomination, or if they offered no description at all. In addition, candidates standing for the Cumbernauld Independent Councillors’ Alliance in North Lanarkshire and the East Dunbartonshire Independent Alliance are treated as Independents.

We are grateful to the Local Government Chronicle Elections Centre at the University of Plymouth for printing this collection. Although every effort has been made to ensure accuracy it is inevitable that errors will remain. These, we hope, are few and inconsequential but we apologise for them in advance.

COMMENTARY ON THE RESULTS

Introduction

As noted in the Preface, the Scottish local elections of 2007 were especially noteworthy for the introduction of the Single Transferable Vote (STV) method of election. Inevitably, therefore, much of our discussion and analysis of the results focuses on the impact of the electoral system. At the same time, however, local elections continue to be interpreted as good indicators of the standing of the parties and of the health of local democracy and we also refer to these issues in what follows.

In our commentary on the 2003 results we suggested that in terms of council seats won Labour would be the main loser under the new system and the SNP the main gainer. Other research concurred in this judgement (see Curtice and Herbert, 2005). If that alone made the outlook gloomy for Labour in 2007, then the picture was worsened by a decline in support for the party in Scotland and an increase in support for the SNP towards the end of 2006 which continued into 2007, as measured by voting intentions for the Scottish Parliament election. Although individual polls gave rather different figures, the overall trend is unmistakeable. Table 1 shows that Labour slipped from 34% of voting intentions in the autumn of 2006 to 30% in April 2007 (having had 34.6% of the constituency vote in 2003). Meanwhile, the SNP overtook Labour and reached 37% in April 2007 (having had 23.9% of the constituency vote in 2003).

It was not only the change to the electoral system which threatened Labour's dominance of Scottish local government, therefore, but the simple fact that the party was relatively unpopular in the run-up to the 2007 elections. Before examining patterns of party support, however, we look at candidates, contests, rejected ballots and turnout. It should be noted that in previous commentaries we have excluded the islands councils from the analysis and from the relevant data in the tables. Here, however, all councils are included.

Candidates

In the previous round of Scottish local elections in 2003 a new record was set for the number of candidates put forward – almost 4,200 for the 1,222 council seats at stake. In advance of the 2007 elections two contradictory arguments about the likely impact of STV on candidatures could be made. On the one hand, in areas where particular parties would have

had little chance of success in first-past-the-post wards, they might have been encouraged to put forward candidates in the hope of picking up some seats under the proportional system. On the other, under STV an individual party would be unlikely to win all the seats in a ward and a logical course of action would be to put forward only as many candidates as the party thought it could win. This would avoid first preference votes being split among too many candidates. On this basis a decline in the numbers of candidates would be anticipated and, as Table 2 indicates, this is indeed what transpired.

Only in two wards (in East Ayrshire and North Lanarkshire) did a party (Labour) put forward a full slate of candidates. Overall, the number of candidates declined to 2,606, so that some 1,600 fewer people were involved in the elections as candidates than had been the case in 2003. The biggest declines involved the major parties, with the SNP leading the way (-533) leaving Labour as the leading party in terms of candidates for the first time in a number of years. On the other hand, there was a veritable explosion in Green candidates, and Solidarity (a breakaway from the Scottish Socialist party) entered the fray for the first time with 83 candidates.

The long slow decline of Independents in Scottish local elections was abruptly reversed in 2003 and the revival continued in 2007, at least in terms of levels of candidacy. STV, apparently, was perceived by Independents as an opportunity rather than a reason for strategic withdrawals. The increased presence of Independents was not confined to areas where almost all candidates stand as Independents – the islands councils – and of the 29 mainland councils Independent candidates increased in 19.

Representatives of other parties, groups and causes also came forward in larger numbers than usual. The Scottish Unionist Party ('Proudly Scottish, Proudly British') led this group with 18 candidates, followed by UKIP with 10, the BNP with 7 and local hospital action groups also with 7.

It is claimed by proponents that STV is a more 'democratic' electoral system than first-past-the-post. If the health of local democracy is measured by the willingness of candidates to

come forward, however, then its introduction appears to have had an unfortunate – and probably unforeseen – effect. Parties are the main recruiters of candidates and the tactical calculations of the parties in the light of STV meant that they did not want to recruit as many as before. As experience of the working of the new system is acquired, it is possible that their tactics as far as candidatures are concerned will become increasingly sophisticated.

One of the unmistakable trends in Scottish local elections since 1974 has been a steady increase in the number of women candidates and councillors. It is also sometimes suggested that proportional electoral systems encourage more women candidates, and result in more women being elected, since parties might deem it politic to put forward, say, one woman and one man in a ward. As indicated in the Preface, a change in the rules affecting names on the official nomination form means that in some cases it is difficult to tell from the name given whether a candidate is male or female. This involves relatively few cases, however, so that while the data summarised below (Table 3) may not be precisely accurate we are confident that they provide a fair summary of the overall position. As the data show, there was a clear decline in the proportion of candidates who are female and this occurred for each of the major parties. Again this could be an unforeseen consequence of the introduction of STV. The parties were looking for fewer candidates and in the scramble to be selected women appear to have lost out. It may be, of course, that in the past women were willing to act as, or were often selected as, sacrificial lambs in hopeless wards and under STV there was less need for such candidates. In any event, it appears that providing a choice of male and female candidates to the voters did not play any significant part in the selection of candidates. As in 2003, of the major parties the Liberal Democrats had the largest proportion of women candidates and Labour the smallest. Among Green party candidates, however, the proportion of women reached 39%.

Although there was a decline in the proportion of women candidates the proportion of women councillors remained as it was in 2003 (21.8%). This supports the suggestion that previously many women were candidates in unwinnable wards, since the greatly reduced number of women candidates won as many council seats as before. Summary Table 5 shows

that 44.9% of women candidates were elected in 2007 (the figure for men was 47.5%) compared with only 23.0% in 2003.

Contests

In respect of the proportion of wards contested, Scottish local elections have been transformed over the past 25 years. In 1980 more than a quarter (26.0%) of District council wards on the Scottish mainland were uncontested but that figure has fallen very steadily and by 2003 only 2.5% of mainland wards were uncontested. When the islands are included, the figure for 2003 was 5% of wards. Under STV, as previously noted, parties have a strong incentive to contest wards in previously unpromising areas. Moreover, it is easy to force a contest in a multi-member ward by nominating just one candidate. It is no surprise, therefore, that in 2007, for the first time ever, not a single ward in Scotland was uncontested. Indeed, only 13 of the 353 wards had just one more candidate than there were councillors to be elected. The SNP contested 95% of wards, the Conservatives 94%, Labour 86% and the Liberal Democrats 77%.

Rejected Ballots

Voting in a first-past-the-post election is easy and familiar – all that a voter has to do is mark an ‘X’ opposite the name of the preferred candidate. Nonetheless, there are always some ballots that are rejected or regarded as ‘spoilt’ for one reason or another – some are deliberately spoiled, for example, because there is no candidate representing the party supported by the voter, others are accidentally spoiled. Voting under STV is unfamiliar and more complicated – the voter has to list candidates in order of preference – and, despite the fact that the Electoral Commission and others conducted public information campaigns on how to vote, we would expect there to be more incorrectly completed ballots. Table 4 shows the number of rejected ballots in 2007 as compared with the previous two rounds of elections and these as a percentage of all ballots. As can be seen, there was indeed a sharp increase in rejected ballots (although to nothing like the extent that occurred in the Scottish Parliament elections). Given the unfamiliarity of STV for most people, 1.83% of ballots rejected seems not an unreasonable figure. The vast majority of voters were clearly able to handle preferential voting.

Rejected ballots for individual councils are shown in Summary Table 2. The smallest proportion was in East Dunbartonshire (1.11%) and the largest, strangely enough, in West Dunbartonshire (2.77%).

Turnout

The most important measure of the health of local democracy is usually thought to be the turnout of electors. That there are falling numbers of uncontested returns in local elections shows that the parties are certainly interested but are the voters? Since the last three rounds of local elections have coincided with Scottish Parliament elections this is a difficult question

to answer. The common assumption is that people are keener to vote in the Scottish Parliament elections than in the locals but, having turned up for the former are happy to fill in their ballot for the council. This seems to take a patronising view of local government and of voters. It may be that some people actually go along to vote in the local elections and vote in the Scottish Parliament election while they are at it. In this respect it is worth remembering that in the 1995 council elections the turnout of 45% was not far short of the 49% who voted in the 2003 Scottish Parliament election. As long as the two sets of elections are ‘coupled’, however, we will not have an independent measure of voters’ interest in local elections.

Table 5 shows the local election turnout in 1999, 2003 and 2007. Overall, turnout increased in 2007 to 53.8%. The increase was doubtless due to the fact that the Scottish Parliament election was widely expected to be a close-run thing.

Turnout figures for the various councils are given in Summary Table 1. There was considerable variation across councils – from 44.3% in Glasgow (the only council below 50%) to 64.7% in East Renfrewshire. The figure exceeded 60% in four councils. In part, these differences are by-products of differential turnout in the Scottish Parliament elections – which is affected, most notably, by variations in constituency marginality – but more generally they reflect the contextual variables which are regularly associated with variations in turnout, such as the socio-economic composition of the area concerned. These latter factors tend to make variations in turnout across local authorities relatively predictable and this is illustrated by the fact that the correlation coefficient measuring the strength of the association between turnout at the 2003 local elections and local turnout in 2007 across the 32 council areas was +0.825. This indicates a very strong relationship – councils which had higher turnouts in 2003 also had higher turnouts in 2007; those where turnout was lower in 2003 were also towards the bottom end in 2007.

The range of turnouts at ward level was, of course, even larger. The ward which recorded the highest turnout (69.7%) was Netherlee, Stamperland and Williamwood in East Renfrewshire but it was 65% or more in 19 wards. At the other extreme turnout was below 40% in 9 wards, 7 of them in Glasgow, including Anderston/City which had the lowest turnout of all at 34.4%.

There was a slight but significant difference in turnout between wards which elected three and those electing four councillors. In the former, mean turnout was 56.0% and in the latter it was 53.4%.

Patterns of Party Support

Insofar as they pay attention to local elections, what most concerns the media and the general public is the performances of the parties, especially the numbers of seats won and lost. We

begin this section by looking at support for the parties among the voters. Under STV there is no measure of party support that is as straightforward as share of votes under first-past-the-post. In other STV systems (Ireland, for example) the convention is to use first preference votes as indicators of party support and to aggregate the first preferences obtained by all candidates of a party within each electoral district in order to arrive at figures showing the distribution of party support. That is the procedure adopted here and Table 6 compares the distribution of party support in 2007 with the two previous sets of elections.

It is difficult to know whether the introduction of STV made any substantial difference to patterns of party support. On the whole, we suspect not and would suggest that the 2007 figures reflect the popularity of the parties at least as effectively as the figures for previous elections. As in the Scottish Parliament elections, the SNP gained ground and Labour lost ground in the local elections.

The level of Conservative support reached an all-time low in Scotland in the 1995 local elections (11.3%) but since then the party has staged a mini-recovery, which by 2003 saw the Tories back above 15% of the votes cast. In 2007 they inched further forward to 15.6%, although in part this may be attributed to them contesting a higher proportion of wards. This is still poor for a party that used to run Labour close in Scotland (admittedly now in the distant past) but at least the Conservatives appear to be moving in the right direction, if rather slowly. The Liberal Democrats, on the other hand, fell back to their 1999 level. The SNP had suffered a sharp setback in 2003 in what was a disappointing set of elections for the party, but in 2007 they recovered somewhat, although their performance was still not as strong as it had been in 1999. To a large extent, however, this reflects the SNP policy of restricting the number of candidates that they put forward. In two-thirds of all wards (more than 70% excluding the islands) the SNP put forward just one candidate. This may have been an effective strategy in terms of winning seats, but it could have reduced the number of first preference votes received. Support for Independents increased slightly, most probably because of the increase in the number of Independent candidates.

Labour's vote share in 2003, at just under a third, represented the party's worst performance in Scottish local elections since 1977 (when they had 31.6%), but in 2007 support fell well below that to produce Labour's worst local showing since the local government structure was

overhauled in 1974. It is doubtful, however, whether this represents a judgement on the performance of Labour councils. Clearly, Labour at UK level was undergoing a period of unpopularity and the SNP was particularly resurgent in Scotland for reasons that had little to do with how effectively or otherwise local councils and councillors were performing.

Further details of the pattern of party support in the 32 councils are given in Summary Tables 7 and 8. The Conservatives had the largest share of first preference votes in four councils – Dumfries and Galloway, East Renfrewshire, Scottish Borders and South Ayrshire – although all four parties were very close in terms of first preferences in Edinburgh. Despite a generally poor performance, Labour was the most popular party in 15 councils. On the other hand, the party exceeded 40% of first preferences in only four ‘heartland’ areas – Glasgow, East Ayrshire and North and South Lanarkshire. The SNP led in terms of first preference votes in seven councils and had 40% in Dundee. Apart from the islands, there is no council in which the SNP could be classed as an irrelevance. In contrast, Liberal Democrat support remained very variable. They did best in Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire, Scottish Borders and Fife, but are very weak across a whole swathe of councils in the central belt – notably Glasgow, Ayrshire, Lanarkshire, West Dunbartonshire and Falkirk, where they hardly register. In addition to the three islands councils, Independents garnered most votes in Argyll and Bute, Highland and Moray.

Despite changes in the *level* of support for the parties from 2003 to 2007, the *relative* strength of the parties across authorities was very similar in both sets of elections. Correlating the parties’ vote shares at council level in 2003 and 2007 (excluding the islands) gives coefficients of 0.927 for the Conservatives, 0.972 for Labour, 0.857 for the Liberal Democrats and 0.939 for the SNP. These indicate very strong relationships and show that there was strong continuity in the geography of party support. Using the regression equations on which the correlation coefficients are based enables us to identify councils where the parties did unexpectedly well or badly on the basis of their 2003 performance. On this basis the Conservatives did better than expected in Moray, Dumfries and Galloway and East Renfrewshire but had relatively poor results in North Ayrshire and East Lothian. North Ayrshire was also a relatively poor result for Labour but rather good results were achieved in Inverclyde and Renfrewshire. The Liberal Democrats did relatively badly in Inverclyde – where they had previously controlled the council – but relatively well in Highland and Argyll and Bute. The SNP had no particularly bad results but did best, given the 2003 score, in Moray, Dundee and Midlothian.

Seats Won

To many people, what matters most in local elections is winning seats. That, rather than ups and downs in the shares of the votes, is what determines control of the local council and all the consequences that follow from that. Moreover it is in respect of the distribution of seats that STV would be expected to have a major impact. As noted above, it was anticipated that Labour would be the main loser and the SNP the main gainer as a result of STV. As a consequence, it was predicted, fewer councils would be controlled by a single party and most would either be governed by some form of coalition or have to make some other arrangements. So it proved.

Table 7 shows the total number of seats won by each of the parties in 2003 and 2007 (Summary Table 9 shows the number won in 2007 in individual authorities). As anticipated, Labour lost seats (-160) and the SNP gained (+182). The Conservatives also benefited from

proportional representation with a gain of 20 seats but the small decline in Liberal Democrat seats is probably due to a decline in the party's popularity, rather than the operation of STV. Despite the increase in Independent candidates the number of seats held by Independents declined to its lowest level since the current local government system was instituted in 1995.

The distribution of seats in 2007 is obviously more proportional to first preference votes than the votes-seats comparison for 2003. In the latter election Labour obtained almost 42% of the seats on the basis of 33% of the votes; in 2007 28% of first preferences rewarded them with 28.5% of the seats. The SNP, on the other hand got only 15% of seats for 24% of votes in 2003 but almost 30% of seats for 28% of first preference votes in 2007. Overall, the index of disproportionality (the sum of differences between % of seats and % of votes divided by two) was 18.2 in 2003 and 7.5 in 2007.

How did the 2003 elections affect the political map of Scotland in terms of party control of the councils? On the basis of the election results, Table 8 illustrates the pattern of party control in 2007 as compared with the situation after the three previous sets of elections.

Between 1995 and 2003 cracks were certainly appearing in the Labour monolith as the number of councils with no overall control increased. The impact of STV in 2007, however, is very clear. 'Hung' councils, with their attendant problems and opportunities, are now the

norm. The only councils with one party or group in control are Glasgow and North Lanarkshire (Labour) and the three islands councils (Independent).

‘Alphabetical’ Voting

In the aftermath of the elections there were complaints made (frequently by defeated councillors) that the STV system had favoured candidates placed near the top of the ballot paper (i.e. those with surnames starting with a letter towards the beginning of the alphabet). It appears that voters wanting to vote for the candidates of a particular party tended to give their first preference to the candidate coming first on the ballot and subsequent preferences to those lower down. Perusal of ward results certainly gives the impression that this was indeed the case but Table 9 gives irrefutable proof. It is based on wards in which a party had two candidates and compares the number of cases in which the candidate whose name came first on the ballot received more first preferences with those in which the lower-placed candidate received more.

Clearly coming early in the ballot paper was a significant advantage in terms of gaining first preference votes. For each party the difference is much greater than would be expected by chance. Whether this will lead to a review of STV – with places on the ballot perhaps being determined by lot – or whether really keen candidates will change their name to something beginning with ‘A’ remains to be seen.

Conclusion

The 2007 Scottish council elections dramatically redrew the political map of local government in Scotland. Whereas the populous central belt could previously be described a series of one-party ‘statelets’ with massive Labour majorities on most councils, this is no longer the case. Given Labour’s unpopularity in 2007, it was always likely that there would be significant change in the political composition of councils but there is little doubt that the new electoral system played a major part in effecting significant change and will, if retained, have a permanent effect. In addition to producing sweeping changes in the political composition of councils, the 2007 elections also produced major changes in the personnel sitting in the council chambers. In 2003, 84% of incumbent councillors defended their seats; in 2007 only 62% fought a seat under the new arrangements. Although some may have been put off by the larger wards and the new electoral system, it seems likely that the big drop in the proportion of incumbents seeking re-election is explained by the ‘golden goodbye’ (a cash payment for service given) offered by the Scottish Parliament to those who retired and also by the fact that the Labour party – by far the biggest party in Scottish local government

after 2003 – did not want to put forward a full slate of candidates even in wards where they previously held all the first-past-the-post seats. In addition, the combination of STV and the changed popularity of the parties meant that an unusually large number of incumbents who did stand were not successful in winning a seat. Whereas in 2003 76% of those who won council seats were already incumbents, in 2007, the figure was only 51%. Turnover of this magnitude is unlikely to be repeated in future elections.

It may be that the introduction of STV will, as proponents suggest, blow a breath of fresh air through the musty corridors of Scottish local government and increase the interest of electors in the doings of their local councils. It is to be hoped that it will be a case of change and renewal rather than ‘change and decay’. It remains our view, however, that holding local elections separately from the Scottish Parliament elections is a necessary further step along this route. ‘Decoupling’ would increase interest in, and attention to, council elections and enable local voters more easily to hold their local representatives to account.
